JOIN US IN PROVIDING A HOME AWAY FROM HOME

As part of the Project Sanctuary Capital Campaign to add additional lodging for at-risk military families, the first major project undertaking is the addition of the Tiny Home Village. This will meet the needs of families by giving them a private space to begin their healing journey while at their therapeutic retreat. Project Sanctuary has a goal to secure funding in 2024 and have the tiny homes installed by March 2025. These new homes will provide a home away from home for 4 additional new military families at each retreat.

Naming Opportunities Available

TINY HOME VILLAGE: \$500,000 | 4 INDIVIDUAL UNITS: \$150,000 EACH

10 percent of each gift will support annual programming.

Naming rights support includes the following direct expenses tied to the development of the tiny home village:

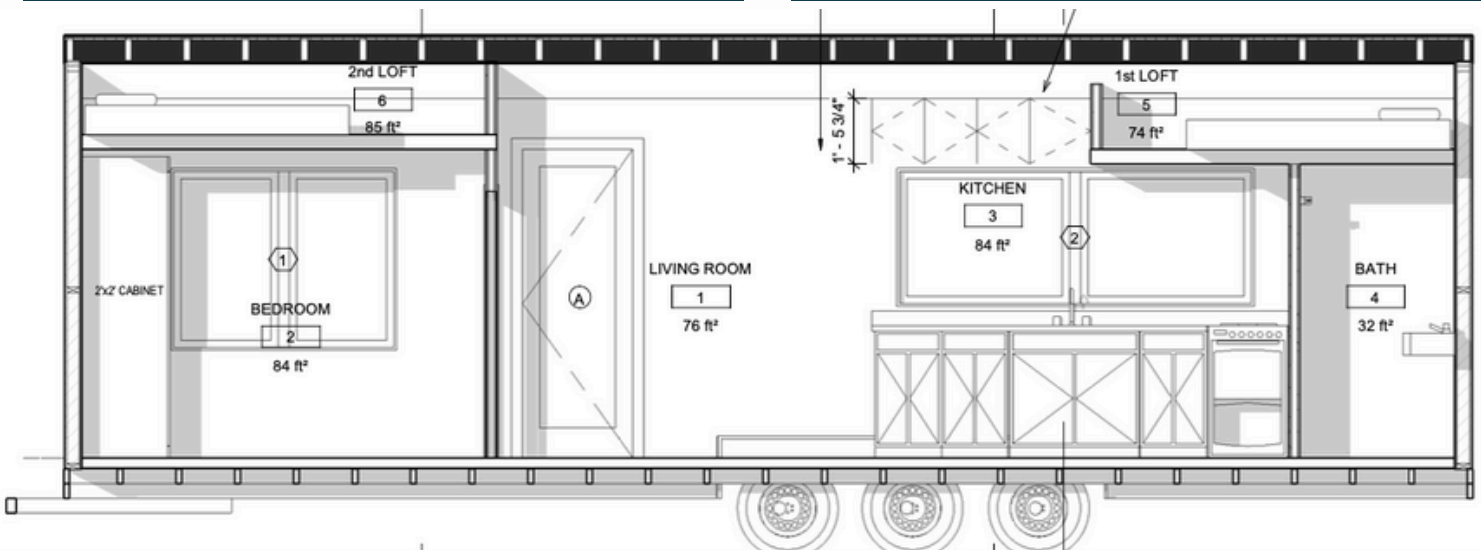
THE TROVE

Built by veterans at Operation Tiny Home, "The Trove" – a remarkable tiny home that holds the key to a joyful life! This thoughtfully designed residence boasts a generous 10-foot width and extends 36 feet in length. With its wider floor plan, this home accommodates a comfortable arrangement where the sofa is positioned opposite a small electric fireplace, allowing ample room for mobility.

The kitchen, while compact, is remarkably functional, providing enough space for meal preparation and cooking, making you feel right at home. The main floor also features a private bedroom.

The bathroom includes a full size shower and offers a livable layout with ample storage thoughtfully integrated around the toilet area. Natural light flows in through a privacy window positioned high up, ensuring it doesn't feel confined.

There are 2 lofts. One being situated above the kitchen and bathroom boasts a height of 6 feet and 8 inches. There is another loft situated above the private bedroom.

EXPANDING FAMILY LODGING FOR MILITARY FAMILIES

The recent purchase of a 42-acre retreat center in Pagosa Springs, Colorado, brings a unique and exciting opportunity for expansion of family lodging with 4 existing RV pads. A search for a like-minded organization that would be able to provide a home-like setting to military families attending a therapeutic retreat began.

Operation Tiny Home (OTH) is a nonprofit that builds affordable, high-quality tiny homes that support veterans, natural disaster survivors, young adults aging out of foster care, and other at-risk populations. Together, we will create a Tiny Home Village at the new retreat center with the help of The Building a Better Future for Veterans Program at OTH. (<https://www.operationtinyhome.org/>)

Project Sanctuary is a 501 c(3) national nonprofit in the process of moving its headquarters from Granby, Colorado to Pagosa Springs, Colorado. Founded in 2007 by Heather Ehle RN, based on the principle that when one person serves, the whole family serves, and understanding the best way to support the troops was to create an organization supporting the entire family. Military families experience a multitude of familial challenges due to ongoing deployments in which the family members are separated from their active-duty family member, frequent moves due to station changes which can occur as frequently as every 18 months, and sustained stressors due to a limited work/life balance.

Project Sanctuary is one of the few national organizations empowering the entire military family to achieve family connection through an evidence-based approach providing counseling, education, referrals to best-fit resources, and therapeutic recreation. Project Sanctuary has served more than 9,157 participants at 294 therapeutic retreats in the past 16 years and is excited to expand our mission with the addition of a new therapeutic retreat center in Pagosa Springs, Colorado.
